# **Covid-19 Changes Ahead**

In light of the Delta variant and government guidelines, Dove of Peace will be revising our policies again. It seems likely that we will require masks for all individuals in the indoor worship service (9:30 a.m.) starting next Sunday. And that masks will be optional at the outdoor service (8:00 a.m.) for those who are fully vaccinated. We will announce a complete policy later this week, but you should plan to bring your mask next Sunday, if you plan to worship indoors.

# (Current) Covid-19 Policy

Mouth and nose coverings (masks) are optional for worshipers who have been fully vaccinated for Covid-19.

Masks are required for worshipers who have not been vaccinated for Covid-19.

# **EXTRA PRECAUTIONS AREA**

The northeast quadrant of the sanctuary is set aside for worshipers who are taking extra precautions to protect themselves and others.

- Masks must be worn.
- 2. A physical distance of at least six feet must be maintained.
- 3. The exchange of peace is made only with words, and only at a distance of at least six feet.

# Dominic, founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), died 1221

Dominic was a Spanish priest who saw the wealth of the clergy as a stumbling block for the church, so he formed a movement, the Order of Preachers (commonly called Dominicans) devoted to itinerant preaching and living in poverty.

Schmücke dich is a German communion hymn, with a text by Johann Franck and a melody by Johann Crüger. We sing it today as our Hymn of the Day, #488, "Soul, Adorn Yourself with Gladness". The melody is joyful and dancelike, celebrating the communal feast of the Lord's Supper. Bach's setting from his "Great Eighteen" chorale preludes is among his most beautiful and contemplative organ works, featuring the melody, adorned with ornamentation, above a gentle duet in the accompaniment parts.

# FIRST READING: I Kings 19:4-8

First Kings chapter 18 describes the contest between Elijah and the prophets of Baal. The contest proves that the Lord is God, and afterward Elijah orders the killing of the Baal prophets. Angered by the deaths of her prophets, Queen Jezebel threatens to kill Elijah. This reading finds Elijah fleeing, fatigued, and in utter despair.

He asked that he might die: "It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors." Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, "Get up and eat." He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones, and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again. The angel of the Lord came a second time, touched him, and said, "Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you." He got up, and ate and drank; then he went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God.

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




# \*PREFACE (Sundays in Ordinary Time)

If you wish, you may join hands with members of your own household. Please do not join hands with others unless you have prior consent.


Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us.

#### \*INVITATION TO THE MEAL

# **Option One: Communion by intinction** (as before Covid)

Worshipers may stand or kneel at the altar rail. The bread wafer will be placed in your hand by the pastor. When the chalice is offered, you may dip the tip of the wafter into the wine, and then consume the wafer.

# Option Two: Packaged wafer and wine

A sealed packet will be available at (or near) the baptismal font. After taking the packet and returning to your seat, you may open the top of the packet to remove the wafer and consume it. Then, turn the packet over, remove the seal over the wine, and sip the wine.


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

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# Chaconne in F Minor Johann Pachelbel (1653-1706)

A Chaconne is a type of musical composition that was popular in the Baroque period. Chaconnes use a simple repeated bass line as the thematic basis for musical variations. Pachelbel's F minor Chaconne is based on a simple four note descending bass line, upon which he has composed 22 different variations, using a variety of contrapuntal techniques and textures.
